SCHOOL FEES

Over the past few years, we have been pleased to keep our school fees frozen to help support families facing the pressures of rising living costs. After careful discussion with our School Board and a recommendation from Catholic Education South Australia, we are writing to inform our school families of a small adjustment to school fees for the 2025 school year.

In 2025, there will be a modest 3% increase in school fees. This adjustment will enable us to continue enhancing our school facilities and infrastructure, ensuring that we can provide the best possible learning environment now and for future generations.

The Term 3 2025 mid-year Reception intake shall again be offered to families free of charge - no tuition fees for the first six months.

At Star of the Sea, we are deeply committed to making Catholic education accessible and affordable for all. End of Year Testing and Data Collection

Currently, our learners across all cohorts are undertaking diagnostic assessments in DIBELS (phonics/reading), PAT R (reading) and PAT M (numeracy). This is part of our ongoing commitment to track student progress, development and growth. These results will be analysed by our classroom teachers and leadership, at an individual, class and whole school level to ascertain areas that show strengths and areas that require an increased focus for 2025. Our DIBELS data will be used to inform Tier 2 and Tier 3 intervention supports required for 2025.

Student wellbeing is also collected each term, and it is important to remember that academic success and student wellbeing are closely linked, with each influencing and reinforcing the other. Elements such as self-esteem, persistence, motivation, resilience and a growth

mindset all contribute to students' positive wellbeing and experiences at school. We are encouraged that this will be a priority in 2025 as we commence our whole school commitment to PBIS (Positive Behaviour Intervention Supports).

Numerical Acumen Awards

Year 4TO have been working on their basic number facts using Numerical Acumen. This platform challenges students to master mental computation strategies and aims to increase the recall speed of basic number facts and other mathematical facts as well as improve accuracy and speed to calculate the answers to Mathematic problems. This year, the class entered the *Numerical Acumen Semester One Challenge* and three of our students have won awards for achievements in the Year 4 category. Congratulations to:

Religious Literacy Assessment Tool (ReLAT) results

Last term our our school participated in an assessment in Religious Education for all Year 4 students in South Australia Catholic Schools. This annual assessment has been developed by the Catholic Education Office.

Religious Education (RE) is a core Learning Area in all Catholic schools. It is a foundation for all learning and is integrated into the life of the school through prayer, liturgy and social justice programs.

ReLAT focuses on knowledge content which is core to the Year 3/4 *Crossways* Religious Education curriculum. As a basic knowledge test, ReLAT complements the continuous, fuller, and deeper assessment of learning that occurs in the RE classroom. It gives results across 5 domains of learning: God, Us and Faith, Sacred Texts, Church for the World, Moral Life and Sacramentality and Prayer.

The results for Star of the Sea were outstanding, with our students being above the state average in all 5 domains.

Limiting screen time and putting in place routines and behaviours for a good night's sleep, will see your child more alert and ready for the day. READINESS FOR LEARNING



Good sleep has great benefits!

Sleep is like magic for babies and children! It:

- Restores Energy: Sleep helps kids feel strong and ready for the day ahead. It's like recharging their batteries!
- Boosts Learning: When babies and children sleep, their brains get supercharged, helping them remember things better and learn new stuff faster.
- Keeps Them Healthy: Sleep makes their bodies strong and helps fight off germs and illness. It's like putting on a superhero suit for their immune system!
- Helps Them Grow: Did you know that children grow when they sleep? It's true! Their bodies make a special growth hormone while they snooze.

Children Need Different Sleep at Different Ages:

- Babies need lots of sleep because they're growing super-fast.
- As children get older, they need a bit less sleep, but it's still super important.
- Sleep changes as kids grow too! Babies sleep a lot during the day, but as they get bigger, they snooze more at night like grown-ups.


How much sleep? At Raisingchildren.net.au we learn that:

- Newborns sleep on and off during the day and night. They sleep for 14-17 hours in every 24 hours.
- Babies 3-6 months usually sleep for 12-15 hours in every 24 hours.
- Toddlers need 11-14 hours of sleep every 24 hours. Usually this is a sleep of 10-12 hours a night, and a nap of 1-2 hours during the day.
- Children aged 3-5 years need 10-13 hours of sleep a night.
- Children aged 5-11 years need 9-11 hours of sleep a night.
- Teenagers generally need about 8-10 hours of sleep a night.

Adults? We need good sleep too and 8 hours a night is a good amount. Sleeping well helps us concentrate, cope with life's stressors, and more easily make plans and decisions.

If your child is sick.....

Unfortunately, children are sick from time to time and not in a condition to be at school, possibly sharing illness with others. We appreciate that it can be difficult to make a decision as a parent to determine if your child is 'sick enough' to stay away from school. We have had several students unwell this week and ask for your support to keep your child home until they are fit to be back at school.
